The Facts*

- 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. is the peak time for juvenile crime in California during school days, with 35% of juvenile crimes occurring during this time period.
- **80% of parents** agree that afterschool programs help to give parents peace of mind about their children when they are at work.
- With **2.4 million students** in California waiting to get into an afterschool program, increased investment in afterschool programs is needed.
- Afterschool programs provide a solid return on investment. Research spanning several states shows that every \$1 invested in afterschool programs saves at least \$3 by:
 - Increasing kids' earning potential
 - Improving kids' performance at school
 - Reducing crime and juvenile delinquency

Why Programs Like the Y are Important

After the bell rings, all children deserve to have a safe place to go until their parents/caretakers get home from work.

Afterschool programs are an integral support for children, families and communities. When the school day comes to an end, quality afterschool programs are keeping kids safe, inspiring them to learn, serving as a source of support and comfort to working families and even helping working parents be more productive at work.

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) states that afterschool programs can help improve a student's report card and their health while lowering their risks for too much sedentary screen time, bad food choices and high-risk social behavior. Unsupervised students often do not have opportunities to make healthy choices.

A 2016 report by the Centers for American Progress states that "misaligned school schedules cost the U.S. economy \$55 billion in lost productivity annually...First, they result in lower levels of full-time employment among women with elementary-school-age children... Second, the economy loses productivity due to school closings. When school is closed, many parents have to take time off from work in order to care for their children."

Who is the Y?

At the Y, our purpose is strengthening communities with a focus on three key areas of impact: youth development, healthy living and social responsibility. We serve Orange County, Riverside County, Pomona Valley, and East San Gabriel Valley through 6 Health & Wellness locations (Diamond Bar, Fullerton, Huntington Beach, Laguna Niguel, Mission Viejo and Newport-Mesa), 2 program centers (Rancho Mission Viejo and Yorba Linda/ Placentia), an aquatics and soccer complex (Santa Ana), numerous community services and youth programs, 80 child & youth development centers, preschool & early learning programs and TK-kindergarten wrap around programs. Donations, grants and legacy gifts ensures Y programs are "Open to All" regardless of an individual's or family's financial circumstances. 100% of donations support our Financial Assistance Program or subsidized programs for marginalized populations.
